## Reef Ball Foundation Project Summaries 2010-2011

## **Montserrat Near Shore Restoration Project:**

The Montserrat Reef Project is an opportunity to shift the focus from what has been lost from the volcanic crisis to what the island is doing to resurrect itself. In a region that has serious marine environmental issues, the Montserrat Reef Project will be a leader within the Caribbean. The very realistic goal of the project is to create a standard which others are measured. The new artificial reef will be designed as an educational snorkel trail to clearly highlight the beauty of Montserrat's marine life. The reef will be accessible by any dive tour businesses, locals, tourists and there alike, as the project is designed and located for the full community to use. The new reef has over a hundred year potencial life span. With this comes the potential to generate new income possibilities for generations. Goals of the Project:

- -Our goals for the project are three fold, increase tourism, protect Montserrat's marine ecosystem, and enhance local fisheries.
- -The Montserrat Reef Project will support tourism by creating a new and exciting attraction for visitors by building an interactive artificial reef. This reef will be accessible to kayakers, snorkelers, and divers, as well as general beach goers.
- -After we have the initial reef structures built, we will work to save corals that will be destroyed during the necessary building of Little Bay, Montserrat. With the help of scientists we will take coral cuttings from live corals and transplant them onto our new artificial reef.
- -By doing this, and by the general design of the reef structure its self, we will enhance local fisheries by creating an ideal environment for fish nurseries which will help to increase local fish populations.

Perform a full marine survey of the site. Initial surveys have been performed, however through marking and mapping of the sites will be required. This will be done with help from experienced scientist and qualified professionals from the HYPERLINK "http:// www.reefball.org/index.html" \t " blank" Reef Ball Foundation. The project will be managed by Montserrat registered marine contractor HYPERLINK "http:// www.caribbeanmarineprojects.com/Home.html" \t "\_blank" Caribbean Marine Projects (CMP). Build reef habitats from scientifically designed molds that mimic coral heads found in nature. These reefs will be built on island with as many local materials and labor as possible. Reef Ball trainers will work with our local team to guarantee the highest quality outcome.

Install reef molds into the sea. This will be done off of an accessible beach away from designated fishing areas and potential disruptions. Again Reef Ball Foundation will aid in finding the best shallow water location for the new Reef Ball reef based off of their expertise. Installation will also require the use of local labour and equipment. The design of the reef will allow for water movement to aid in coral growth and fish habitat. It will also be set up as an interactive snorkeling trail.

Corals will be collected from the existing reefs within the Little Bay development area. They will then be transplanted onto the Reef Ball structures. Reef Ball Foundation experts trained in working with live corals will work with the local team to achieve this delicate stage.

Reef Ball Australia: Moreton Bay Marine Park Fishing Reefs-Queensland 117 Reef Balls (3 sizes, 180-800kg) were deployed in December 2010 by DERM just west of Peel Island and in March 2011, 78 (2 sizes, 270-750 kg) were deployed east of Coochie Mudlo Island in the Moreton Bay Marine Park as part of the Government's commitment to establish six artificial reefs to increase recreational fishing spots.

Reef Balls have now been effectively used as a tool to help manage and enhance recreational fishing in New South Wales, Victoria and Queensland. New South Wales has deployed over 2,000 Reef Balls in five estuaries to increase fishing hot spots. The results have exceeded expectations and the reefs support greater abundance and diversity than nearby natural reefs. Victoria has constructed three recreational fishing reefs in Port Phillip Bay, specifically designed to support snapper and results are very positive. In November 2010 a record 12.3kg snapper was caught on one of the reefs! Queensland is using Reef Balls as part of its program to provide additional fishing spots within the Moreton Bay Marine Park and to compensate fishers for areas that have been declared no-take zones.

Bahrain: Reef Ball Foundation and Reef Ball AU have been doing an extensive training project in Bahrain with government and private contractors: More than 2,500 artificial "reef balls" will be submerged off the coast of Bahrain in a bid to boost the country's marine resources. The cement spheres will be dropped at pre-determined locations in the country's waters over the next year to create artificial reefs measuring 1sqkm in total. Ten potential areas will be chosen for 2,560 reef balls that are designed to encourage the growth of new marine life - providing fresh habitats for Bahrain's declining fish stocks. A deal that paves the way for the project was signed yesterday between the Public Commission for the Protection of Marine Resources, Environment and Wildlife and Posford Haskoning Environment Gulf. Fishermen will initially be banned from areas where the reef balls are located to promote the growth of new marine life. "Bahrain is a country that significantly depends on the sea and fishing and this why we have come up with a strategy to help develop marine resources in the country, especially increasing available stock," said Municipalities and Urban Planning Affairs Minister Dr Juma Al Ka'abi, who was present at the signing."Protecting fisheries resources for future generations is a duty that we have been tasked to handle by the Cabinet in line with Vision 2030.

US Naval Academy: Research project studying various applications of reef balls with various educational projects.

Curacao, NA-Portomaria Survey Project: Monitoring of ongoing reef ball project that was a near shore restoration project after several hurricanes. And survey and assessment of

potential project for another beach associated with Portomaria.

## New Jersey Department of Environment-Fish & Wildlife:

(NJ) Four Hundred Reef Balls Slated for Cape May Reef

The NJDEP Division of Fish and Wildlife has announced that four hundred reef balls constructed at Southern State Correctional Facility at Delmont are ready for deployment on December 16, 2010. The Cape May Reef is located 9.1 nautical miles east of Cape May Inlet. The deployment is part of the state's Artificial Reef Program.

The reef balls will be deployed at the following six locations:

- 1) 38 53.648' 74 40.368'
- 2) 38 51.436' 74 42.418'
- 3) 38 50.557' 74 42.167'
- 4) 38 50.647' 74 42.598'
- 5) 38 50.607' 74 42.177'
- 6) 38 50.648' 74 42.500'

**New York**: Six pilot reefs have been installed in and around *New York* Harbor, at Hastings and in Soundview Park in the *Bronx*. This project is in conjunction with the Bronx River Pilot Oyster Reef project, NY/NJ Baykeepers, US Army Corps of Engineers, The Port Authority of NY, NJ, NYC Parks and Recreation and other partners. Project goals are to restore the natural shoreline areas and oyster restoration.

The Ocean Trust: Volunteers from the Bone Fish Grill teamed up with the Reef Ball Foundation to create a small project off of Cape Fear. This project was supported by the Ocean Trust.

Arizona Fish and Wildlife Fresh Water Research Project: Experimental fresh water fish enhancement project in Lake Tempe. AZ Fish & Game just got a grant to continue their research.

Sarasota Bay Estuary Oyster Project: Oyster habitat restoration project that includes monitoring and research with various partners. SBEP is an intergovernmental partnership dedicated to restoring and protecting Sarasota Bay. Our partners include Sarasota and Manatee counties; cities of Sarasota and Bradenton; Town of Longboat Key; Southwest Florida Water Management District; Florida Department of

Environmental Protection; and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. This project includes a grant from Florida Fish & Wildlife.

Turks and Caicos: Provo beach restoration project with coral nursery and coral planting project.

St. John's Virgin Islands: Assessment and survey for potential break water and reef restoration project with condo association

Environmental Journalists Conference: Reef Ball was invited to present and have booth at the annual conference for environmental journalists which included an ocean theme this year with reunion of the Costeau Family and their new book about Jacque Cousteau.

Coastal Alabama Project: Ongoing project in AL. Project goals are to restore the Alabama coastline from erosion and restore the oyster population which helps forge out (clean) the water. Project partners include Alabama state and local governments, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, The Nature Conservancy and other community organizations. This project is part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. First phases of the project were in Helen Wood Park in Mobile Bay and Dauphin Island. This is an ongoing project, but at this time over a 1000 reef balls were deployed.

Government projects in North Carolina, Texas and South Carolina for various habitat restoration goals.

#### Educational Projects

The Reef Ball Foundation continues to do many school and community projects throughout the country and world just like this girl scout project using hands on activities to help learn about the importance of the ocean. Projects include Dayton Oaks Elementary School, Lucy Barnsley Elementary School and various projects in Florida, Maryland, Virgina, etc.
